COST OF GOVERNANCE

POLICY STATEMENT

Because poor governance costs more than learning to govern well, the Board of Trustees will invest in its governance capacity.

- 1. Board of Trustees' skills, methods, and support will be sufficient to assure governing with excellence.
 - A. Training and retraining will be used liberally to orient new Trustees, as well as to maintain and increase existing member skills and understandings.
 - B. Outside monitoring assistance may be arranged so that the Board of Trustees can exercise confident control over organizational performance. This includes but is not limited to fiscal audit.
- 2. Costs will be prudently incurred, though not at the expense of endangering the development and maintenance of superior capability. Monies will be included in the budget each year for:
 - a. Training, including attendance at conferences and workshops.
 - b. Audit and other third party monitoring of organizational performance.
 - c. Surveys, focus groups, opinion analyses, and meeting costs.
 - d. Meetings of the Board and its Committees.
 - e. Trustee association fees.
 - f. Trustee travel insurance
- 3. The honoraria for trustees will be determined annually in accordance with Ministry of Education regulations governing honoraria, to a maximum as determined by the applicable regulations.
- 4. The Board of Trustees may approve in the budget a supplementary allowance to cover expenses relating to exofficio functions of the Chair and/or the Vice-Chairperson.
